



The Tribunal is taking the following measures given the current COVID-19 situation, effective immediately.

The Tribunal remains open for business but asks that parties and the public refrain from visiting its premises without prior notice.

The Tribunal's electronic filing system is fully operational. The electronic filing of all case documents is mandated by the Tribunal's Rules.

All scheduled in-person appeal hearings (case files beginning with AP, EP, EA) up to Tuesday, April 14, inclusively, are cancelled. The Tribunal will communicate with all affected parties to reschedule hearings. All scheduled filing deadlines are maintained; however, the Tribunal understands that parties may need to seek extensions; these will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

Procurement review cases will continue to follow their course, and scheduled filing deadlines are also maintained; however, as in Appeal cases, the Tribunal will deal with any requests for extension of filing deadlines on a case-by-case basis.

Anti-dumping, countervail, and safeguard matters continue to follow their course and scheduled filing deadlines are maintained. Any requests for extension of filing deadlines will be considered by the Tribunal on a case-by-case basis, as the circumstances permit. The Tribunal's hearing in Inquiry No. NQ-2019-001 (Sucker Rods), currently scheduled to start on March 30, 2020, will proceed by way of a file hearing. The Tribunal will provide parties to the inquiry with additional information concerning the modalities of the file hearing in due course.
